- ✓ Covering 288,347 square kilometres, NSD is located on Treaty 6 and 8 territories in northern Alberta.
- ✓ 95% of students are of either First Nation or Métis heritage.

Northland School Division Success Stories









- ✓ NSD advanced its use of technology to improve student learning and reduce costs with the division due to expense of travel. Courses and instructions are being offered online, which is totally new for NSD. It is now an expectation that every NSD teacher is knowledgeable and skilled in the use of technology tools such as Google Classroom. In 2019-2020, NSD hosted approximately 900 professional learning sessions virtually to help teachers meet and exceed the expectations.
- ✓ Developed "Continuing Student Learning Newsletters" to highlight how NSD schools implemented at-home learning strategies. In addition, NSD shared success stories about students learning from home https://tinyurl.com/yxeoh7ec.
- ✓ Creative juices flowed across NSD to honour 32 graduates. Schools hosted parades and banners with a photo of graduates were installed on light posts. Lawn signs were placed in front of schools and also on the lawns of graduates' homes https://tinyurl.com/y65t78xy.
- ✓ Schools developed land-based learning projects. Projects included archery, shelter building and cooking. Schools are implementing those plans during the 2020-2021 school year.
- ✓ NSD partnering with Northland Alberta Teachers' Association (ATA) Local No.69 to support staff wellness. Examples include virtual comedy show and physical activity challenge.
