Provincial Achievement Test results reveal division-wide participation rate increase and individual student success stories

Associate Superintendent Don Tessier presented the 2015-2016 Provincial Achievement Test results to the Official Trustee. Participation rates division-wide increased by four percent in 2015-2016 in comparison to 2014-2015. The division also announced nine students achieved the standard of excellence in grade 6 and three achieved the same feat in grade 9. Fort McKay School, Anzac Community School, Bill Woodward School and Father R. Perin School students did not write the Provincial Achievement Tests due to the Fort McMurray wildfires. Importance of Local School Board Committees discussed during Official Trustee Report

Official Trustee Lois Byers presented the Official Trustee's Report as information. While discussing the report, she talked about the importance of Local School Board Committees and the role they play in "eliminating the education gap" and healing the damage done by the Residential School legacy. Eliminating the achievement gap between First Nation, Métis and Inuit (FNMI) students and all other students is one of the four desired outcomes listed in Alberta Education's three-year business plan. The members in attendance were asked the question, "What is the Local School Board Committees role in eliminating the gap?"

Summary of approved Board motions

The Official Trustee approved:

- Policy 11 Role of the Superintendent passed Second Reading.
- Policy 13 Appeals and Hearings Regarding Student Matters passed First Reading.
- Policy 19 Welcoming, Caring, Respectful, Safe and Healthy Learning and Working Environments passed First Reading.
- That Northland enter into an agreement with Lubicon Lake Band to allow the Band to carry out testing and investigation to identify strategies for optimizing the sewage lagoon.
- That Northland enter into an agreement with the Lubicon Lake Band for construction of a ball diamond on the division's land.
